## LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, 1961 (No. 11 of 1961)

## KENINGAU DISTRICT COUNCIL (TAMUS) BY-LAWS, 1966 (G.N.L 5 of 1966)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon it by subsection (1) of section 50 of the Local Government Ordinance, 1961, the Keningau District Council has made the following Bylaws:-

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as the Keningau District Council (Tamus) By-laws, 1966, and shall apply to all tamus established in the Keningau District Council area.
  - 2. In these By-laws —

"tamu" means an open air market declared by the Council to be a tamu by notice posted on the Notice Board of the Council and at the tamu ground.

3. No person shall sell any commodity in any tamu except with a licence which may be issued by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Council subject to such conditions as he may impose.

Provided that no licence shall be required for items of village manufacture or local produce other than tobacco and cooked foods.

**4.** Any person whose application for a licence has been refused or who is aggrieved by the conditions imposed on his licence may appeal to the Council at its next meeting and the decision of the Council thereon shall be final.

5. The following fees shall be paid for licences issued under by-law 3:—

- (a) for a licence to sell cloth and 4.00 per month general merchandise of all kinds not being of village manufacture
- (b) for a licence to sell locally 2.00 per month grown tobacco
- (c) for a licence to sell cooked 2.00 per month foods
- (d) for a licence to sell tapai by a 5.00 per month native
- 6. The Council may in writing appoint any person to be a Tamu Master for a tamu who shall be charged with the keeping of order in and the general management of the tamu.
  - 7 Any person who:-
    - (a) sells or exposes for sale any commodity specified in by-law 5 in any tamu
      without a licence or who contravenes the conditions of a licence issued
      under these By-laws; or
    - (b) takes or attempts to take into any tamu any intoxicating liquor, with the exception of tapai; or
    - (c) has in his possession in any tamu any firework, firearm, or any offensive weapon; or
    - (d) fails to comply with any lawful direction of the Tamu Master,

shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a fine of twenty-five ringgit.
