THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE, 1961 (Ordinance No. 11 of 1961)

LABUAN TOWN BOARD (TAMU) BY-LAWS, 1968

In exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 50 of the Local Government Ordinance, 1961 [Ord. No. 11 of 1961.], the Labuan Town Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board) has made the following By-laws:-

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as the Labuan Town Board (Tamu) By-laws, 1968 and shall apply to all tamu established by the Board within the Board's area, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1968..
 - 2. In these By-laws "tamu" means any open-air market declared by the Board to be a "tamu".
- **3.** No person shall sell any commodity in any tamu without a licence which may be issued by the Chairman of the Board and subject to such conditions as he may impose.
- **4.** Any person whose application for a licence has been refused or who is aggrieved by the conditions imposed on his licence may appeal to the Board at its next meeting and the decision of the Board thereon shall be final.
 - 5. The following fees by way of stallage fees shall be paid for licences issued under these By-laws:
 - (a) for a licence to sell cloth and general merchandise of all kinds not being of local manufacture \$5.00 per month;
 - (b) (i) for a licence to sell fruit, vegetables, dried or fresh fish, dried or fresh meat or venison, betel nut, salt, cakes and any other local products otherwise than from a stall free;
 - (ii) for a stall a fee of one dollar shall be charged;
 - (c) for any other licence \$3.00 per month.
- **6.** The Board shall appoint any person to be a Tamu Master who shall be charged with the keeping of order in and the general management of the tamu.
- **7.** Any licensee who fail to comply with any direction given by the Tamu Master within the scope of his authority shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
 - Any person who :
 - (a) sells any commodity in any tamu without a licence issue under these By-laws; or
 - (b) has in his possession in any tamu any firearm, firework, or any offensive weapon; or

(c) being a licensee fails to comply with any lawful direction given by the Tamu Master, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a fine of fifty dollars.

Repeal and Replacement.

9. The Tamu By-laws published under *Gazette* Notification No. S 121 of 1961 is hereby revoked.
