

The North Borneo Cession (Amendment) Order in Council 1950.

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE
THE TWENTY-FIRST DAY OF JULY, 1950.

PRESENT :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the provisions of the North Borneo Cession Order in Council, 1946, in the manner hereinafter appearing :

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

1. This Order may be cited as the North Borneo Cession (Amendment) Order in Council, 1950, and shall come into operation forthwith.

2. The North Borneo Cession Order in Council, 1946, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section ;

“**3A.** Any person who was not a citizen of the State of North Borneo as provided by section 3 of this Order shall be deemed to have become a British subject on the fifteenth day of July, 1946, if –

(a) he was born before the first day of November, 1931, in the State of North Borneo (otherwise than on a ship registered elsewhere than in the State) or on a ship registered in the State; and

(b) he was ordinarily resident in the Colony of North Borneo on the fifteenth day of July, 1946.”
