LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE 1961 (No. 11 of 1961)

PAPAR DISTRICT COUNCIL (STREETS AND PUBLIC PLACES) BY-LAWS 1977

(G.N.L 55 of 1977)

In exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 50(1) of the Local Government Ordinance 1961, the Papar District Council has made the following by-laws:

1. Title and commencement.

These by-laws may be cited as the Papar District Council (Streets and Public Places) By-laws 1977 and shall come into operation on the 1st day January 1978.

2. Interpretation.

In these By-laws, "streets" and public places" mean streets and public places under the control of or vested in the Council.

3. Removal of barriers, etc..

No person not authorised by the Council shall take down, alter or remove any barriers, signs or lights placed by the Council across or in any street.

4. Blind, etc., not to encroach street or public places.

No person shall hang any blind, awning or other structure from any building such as to encroach on to any street.

5. Trees not to be damaged or removed.

No person shall damage or remove any tree or vegetation growing along any street or in any public place.

6. Maintenance of walls, etc..

The owner or occupier of any premises shall keep his wall, fence, post or gate bordering on any street in a good state of repair.

7. Parking of vehicles.

No person shall, unless permitted by the Council, park his vehicle in any street or public place no person shall repair or mend any vehicle in any street or public place.

8. Penalty.

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine of five hundred ringgit. [Mod. Act 160.]

8A. Compounding of offences. [Add. G.N.L 87/84.]

- (1) Any officer of the Council duly authorised by it in writing may in his discretion compound any offence under these By-laws by collecting from a person reasonably suspected of having committed the offence a sum not exceeding one hundred ringgit.
- (2) On payment of such sum of money, no further proceedings shall be taken against the person in respect of such offence.

- (3) The payment shall be evidenced by a receipt issued by the officer so authorised to compound the offence.
- **9.** Repeal. [G.N.S 93/56.]

Part XVII of the Papar (Townships) (General) By-laws 1958 is hereby repealed.
